## The Selfish Man

The learners: middle school students, low-intermediate students, able to read simple short stories.

Time: 50 min

The language context: English as foreign language

The institution: public middle school in China

The course: language skill: reading, comprehension, and vocabulary.

Materials: PowerPoint, short story (The Selfish Man), handout

SLO:

By the end of the class, students will be able to demonstrate their understanding of the short story, "The Selfish Man" by inferring the moral that they can learn from the story.

Students learned in the prior lesson: students learn what moral story is, and what moral story stand for.
